 at San Antonio for some two or three months and
 had been sent home for clothing but a few days
 before the city was taken, that in the month of February
 or January 1836 this affiant was in the service
 in Captain Foster's Company - which company
 was collecting Beef and Provisions for the army
 at Gonzales; that he remained in said company
 until the night of the retreat of the army from
 Gonzales when he was detailed by said Captain
 Foster to look after the property of his father's family
 and that he did not rejoin the army until after
 the battle of San Jacinto. That in the month of
 July 1836 he affiant again entered the service
 by joining the Company of Captain Wade of Mont
 gomery County and that in said company he
 was mustered into the regular Army at Camp John
 son on the Lavaca. That whilst at said Camp Johnson
 affiant was attached to and became a member
 of Captain Sutherlands Ranger or Spy Company
 and he remained a member of this company
 until it was discharged.
