what are commonly called Government lots on a quar-
ter of a league of land the titles of which he
received under the laws; then here previous to
our late struggle — With these exceptions of the
above this deponent says that he has not retain-
ed, sold, or embargued any arms, munitions
of war, or any kind of property whatever belong-
ing to the Republic of Texas; or caused the same
