

The State of Texas,
County of Jefferson, C. M. M. Bumsted, a resident of
the County of Hardin, said State, being duly sworn,
deposes my oath to say: that I am 63 years of age,
and a native of Essex County in the State of New
Jersey; that I immigrated into Texas, from the
City and State of New York in 1831, that continuously
since, I have resided in the present Territory of
the County of Hardin, Texas, save and except a
residence of about one year in the present Territory of
Liberty County; that I am identical with the same
person whose application for pension, supported,
I think, by the proofs of witnesses James Chesser and
Adam or William Wyeley, the first of Hardin County,
since deceased, and the latter of Jasper County, has
been heretofore forwarded through Messrs. C. K. Sims
& Co of Austin, to the Comptroller's office of the State
of Texas; that I served in A.D. 1832, in an ex-
pedition under Mark Johnson, against Bradburn
in command of the Mexican post of Anahuac;
that in A.D. 1835, with a body of men who left
here with Henry Milcard, I went to San Felipe
de Austin, where we organized into a company
whereof the said Henry Milcard was elected Cap-
tain; that thence proceeding with said Company, as
a member thereof, to a point about 15 miles below
San Antonio known as the "Mision del Espada"
or "Mission of the Sword" said Milcard afterwards
