says that he was born on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June  
AD 1805; that about the 1<sup>st</sup> of ~~September~~ <sup>October</sup> 1835  
he joined Capt ~~Albert~~ Martin's Company  
of Volunteers from Gonzales County Texas, and  
that he was appointed 4<sup>th</sup> Corporal in said Company  
that affiant does not know that said Company  
was ever regularly mustered into the Army of  
the Republic of Texas or not - but he thinks  
they were not because he believes that the Army  
of the Republic of Texas was not regularly  
organized for some months perhaps more  
than a year afterwards; that said Company  
was marched to the Salado near San Antonio  
and there they were united to the Army under  
the command of Gen. ~~John~~ <sup>John</sup> Moore
