Dear Sir:

Relative to ~~Cash~~ Claim No. 12635 of Henry Sackett as having rendered service in Company "E" Frontier Forces of Texas from June 6, 1874 to April 24, 1875, beg to advise that this office has no way of ascertaining by the muster roll whether or not service was rendered against Indian depredations, marauding Indians or Mexicans, however, we have on file in this office in book form "Adjutant General's Report 1870-1881" which your Special Examiner A.K. Meek made notation of, and reads as follows:

July 25, 1874-- Sergeant M.T. Israel, Company "E", and twenty one men struck a party of six Indians near head of Clear Fork of Brazos. Killed two Indians and one horse; captured one brave, who next day died of his wounds; captured bows, quivers, arrows, one Spencer rifle, two pistols, &c. One horse (Corporal H. Sackett's) killed in action; S.R. Davis wounded; one horse wounded.

There are no notations on the muster roll and it will be impossible to furnish you with any more information than the above.
