

WILLIAM BARRET TRAVIS' LETTER FROM THE ALAMO, 1836

At the Alamo in San Antonio, then called Bejar, 150 Texas rebels led by William Barret Travis made their stand against Santa Anna's numerically superior Mexican army. On the second day of the siege, February 24, 1836, Travis appealed for reinforcements with this historic letter carried from the Alamo by Captain Albert Martin of Gonzales, a native of Rhode Island.
