Before me, Louis Giraud a Notary Public in and for said County personally appeared Antonio Menchaca, a resident of said County and to me well known, who being by me duly sworn upon his oath deposes and says, that he is a native of San Antonio de Texas, and is now over seventy six years of age.

That he is the identical Antonio Menchaca, who participated in the Revolution of Texas against Mexico and was a ~~Sergeant~~ in the Company of Volunteers Commanded by Captain Juan N. Seguin, at the Battle of San Jacinto on the 21st Day of April 1836.

Affiant further deposes and says, that he was duly Commissioned as a Captain in Col Juan N. Seguin's Regiment in the Fall of 1836, and that the foregoing Roll is a true and correct List of his Company, and that the remarks set opposite the name of each member are true, so far as his memory now serves him, that all of his Company did service as soldiers in the cause of Texas from October 1836, until March 1837, when they were honorably discharged under a general order and paid.

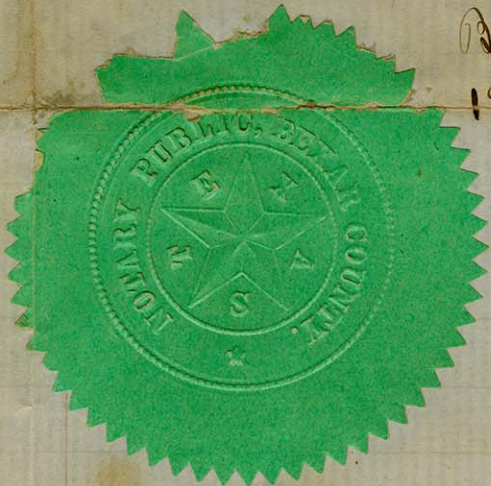
