- Zotero is a citation management tool. It allows you to pull sources from your research, organize them as needed and create citations and/or bibliographies.
- Sources can be collected from the web or uploaded from existing files on your machine.
- You can keep track of your notes all within the same tool.





 - Chrome, Safari, Firefox, IE







Collecting sources

- What do I need? – Firefox add-in or Zotero standalone
- Locate your source.
- Click the Zotero button at the end of the URL.
- Review in Zotero add-in.



Creating citations

- What you need: Word processor plug-in
- Open word processor (Word or OpenOffice)
- Click in the document to place the citation
- From the Add-in Menu, click Insert Citation.



- Make changes as needed.
- Alt-F4 to save


Creating bibliographies

- What you need: Word processing plug-in
- Open word processor (Word or OpenOffice)
- Click where you want the bibliography/reference list
- Insert Bibliography



Access your references anywhere

- Create a Zotero account.
- Use Sync button to send your items to the web.



Use Preferences to setup Zotero to sync automatically.
