Craft: Picnic Basket Hat Make-and-Take





What you need:

- Tables and chairs
- Yellow construction paper, 12" x 18" for basket
- Construction paper strip, 1 1/2" x 18" for handle
- Pictures of picnic food on page 167, or pictures of food from grocery store supplements
- Plastic ants
- Scissors
- Markers
- Glue or tape



What you do:

1. Fold the construction paper in half lengthwise and cut along the fold. You will have two strips of paper, 6" x 18" each. Set one strip aside.
2. Cut the other strip in half widthwise to make two 6" x 9" strips. Glue one of these strips to the long strip. Fit this long strip around the child's head and secure. This is the basket.

The Dirt on Dirt

Audience: Family

This program, centered on dirt and the things that grow in it, will work well for families with children of any age. Pick and choose among these activities or set up stations for your summer kickoff program.

- Dirt: Jump into Science* by Steve Tomecek
- Garbage Helps Our Garden Grow* by Linda Glaser
- A Handful of Dirt* by Raymond Bial

Science Activity: Colorful Celery


This is a fun, easy activity that explores the way plants absorb water.

- Variety of supplies depending on the options selected below.



Infants: Plant a Little Seed

Books to Share

Little Rabbit's Snacktime by Alan Baker. Simple text and illustrations present Little Rabbit's search for a snack. Lift the flaps to see who's eating what, and where, to help motivate young children to focus on the book.

The Number Garden by Sara Pinto. Best shared with small groups or with caregivers and children sitting close to you, this 9" x 9" book heightens print motivation with flaps on each spread revealing an active garden scene.

One Little Seed by Elaine Greenstein

Over in the Garden by Jennifer Ward. Here's another counting book, a musical offering in the style of the folksong "Over in the Meadow." This version introduces readers to several garden insects, and the song invites participation by caregivers.

Garden Glove Peekaboo


What you need:
