



TSLAC building to close from Dec. 22-26 to allow contractors to make HVAC switch

AUSTIN, Texas - The Texas State Library and Archives Commission (TSLAC) will close the Lorenzo de Zavala State Archives and Library Building from December 22 – 26, to allow contractors who are in the process of renovating the 47-year old building, to switch over to a new (HVAC) heating, ventilating and air conditioning system.

The building opened in 1962 and is located in Austin, adjacent to the Capitol Complex. It is undergoing a \$15.5 million dollar legislative appropriated renovation project and serves as the headquarters of the Texas State Library and Archives Commission.
