### **State Library Commissioners to Hold October 2 Meeting at NARA-Fort Worth**

AUSTIN, TX – The next meeting of the Texas State Library and Archives Commission (TSLAC) will take place October 2, 9:45 a.m., at a special location: the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA), 2600 West 7th Street, Suite 162, Fort Worth, Texas.

TSLAC's governing commission is comprised of seven commissioners appointed by the governor of Texas and confirmed by the Texas Senate. They typically meet at the Lorenzo de Zavala State Archives and Library Building, TSLAC's headquarters, in Austin.

Holding the meeting in Fort Worth owes to tradition. Once a year the commissioners try to convene at a location outside of Austin – a nod, in part, to the fact that TSLAC's reach extends clear across Texas.

Past special meetings have been held in Boerne, Rockport, Liberty, Dallas, San Antonio, and Canyon, Texas.

“We're grateful to the Federal Records Center in Fort Worth and the National Archives and Records Administration for hosting our next commission meeting,” said Peggy Rudd, TSLAC Director and Librarian. “As the archival agency of the United States Government, NARA serves Americans in much the same way that TSLAC serves Texans by preserving the archives and records of government permanently for public use.”

Meetings of TSLAC's commission are always open to the public. All are welcome to attend, address the commission, or review the minutes of prior meetings.
