## History Vault Immigration

### Immigration: Records of the INS, 1880-1930

- This module presents the investigations made by the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) during the massive immigration wave at the turn of the twentieth century. The files cover Asian immigration, especially Japanese and Chinese migration, to California, Hawaii, and other states; Mexican immigration to the U.S. from 1906-1930, and European immigration. There are also extensive files on the INS's regulation of prostitution and white slavery and on suppression of radical aliens.
- The files on Chinese immigrants are invaluable sources of social data about individual Chinese immigrants and their lives, as well as the workings of American government as officials struggled to control the borders and stop illegal migration through Canada and Mexico.
- The files on Japanese immigration include investigation of "Japanese picture brides" and other schemes to circumvent exclusion. The INS referred to female Japanese immigrants as picture brides because they were married in Japan by proxy to single men in the United States and then sent on the journey to America.
- Mexico-related files document the influx of Mexican aliens across the borders of Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, and California between the years 1906 and 1930. In addition, there are documents that highlight the efforts of European and Middle Eastern emigrants and Chinese and Japanese immigrants to cross the Mexican border into the United States. Further, there are separate files pertaining to various ports of entry, including Brownsville and Eagle Pass, Texas; Nogales and Naco, Arizona; and Tia Juana and San Diego, California. These files discuss local border conditions, influx of refugees and construction of refugee camps, smuggling, and the labor situation.
- The INS investigated conditions in Europe that encouraged people to immigrate to the United States. These conditions included low wages and poor living conditions in Europe. Philip Cowen's reports from the Jewish part of Russia detail pogroms against Jews as well as substandard living conditions.
- Among the interesting documents pertaining to prostitution and white slavery are the investigation files of Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization inspectors such as Helen Bullis, Frank Gabarino, Earl Coe, and David Lehrhaupt who, in cooperation with local authorities, raided houses of prostitution in cities such as New York, Detroit, Buffalo, Minneapolis, Pittsburgh, Los Angeles, and San Francisco, searching for immigrants within three years of arrival who could be deported on grounds of moral turpitude and in violation of the 1907 Immigration Act.
- The files on suppression of radical aliens document a number of notable figures, including Luigi Galleani, George Andreytchine, Giovanni Baldazzi, Emma Goldman, and Salvatore Schillaci. On the government side, notable correspondents include Commissioner General of Immigration Anthony Caminetti, Assistant Secretary of Labor Louis F. Post, and J. Edgar Hoover (at the time Special Assistant to the Attorney General).
